


**MEALS REDISTRIBUTED** (based on a 350 gram per meal metric)






## Food by Group

# Chairperson's report

A little over seven years ago we began picking up food from Wishbone stores on the way home from work, storing the salads, ready meals and soups in our fridge overnight before dropping them off at the Wellington City Mission the following morning. That all seems like a blink of an eye ago.

When I look at where Kaibosh is today I struggle to believe how far we've come. Matt, Noush and their crack team of drivers and volunteers have elevated Kaibosh to a level I couldn't begin to imagine back when I was constantly testing my Tetris skills to fit unwanted sandwiches into our small fridge.

A second van, the ongoing support we've received from our donors, being named official charity partner of Visa Wellington on a Plate, the consolidation of our role in Wellington Central and the development of our involvement in the Hutt Valley are all significant markers of our ongoing success. And that doesn't touch on the record-breaking levels of food that we've rescued this year. As David Bowie once sang, "Time may change me, but I can't trace time." I'm struggling to comprehend the changes we're seeing but I can't wait to see where the next twelve months takes us.

Finally, I'd be remiss if I didn't pay tribute to Robyn Langlands. She resigned in April after six and a half years as Chairperson. Without her compassion, drive and vision Kaibosh would not exist. Her firm hand on the tiller is missed and trying to live up to the standard she set is a constant challenge for myself and the rest of the Board.

# **General Manager's Report**

2013/2014 has been another year of busy activity and ongoing growth here at Kaibosh.

We have seen the number of community groups that are providing Kaibosh-rescued food to their clients grow to 33, our food donor base has increased to 28 regular contributing businesses and the volume of food that we have been able to rescue and redistribute has increased 44% on the previous year before.

In the twelve months to the end of June, Kaibosh provided 133,342kg of food to those in our community who are most in need. This is enough to provide over 380,000 meals.

Kaibosh is only able to achieve these results with the incredible support that we receive from our community – our funders and in-kind supporters, the businesses who contribute their surplus food, the great community groups we work with, our staff and, most importantly, the amazing team of volunteers who contribute so much to keep the wheels of Kaibosh turning.

In the past year we have seen our service expand beyond Wellington and we are now rescuing and redistributing food in the Hutt Valley. Our focus over the past year has been getting this service underway and we will continue working hard to consolidate and expand this over the next year whilst maintaining a robust and quality service here in Wellington City.

We continue to have a deep belief in our work and the tangible results that we know are being achieved as a result. We offer our sincerest and most humble thanks to all of the amazing groups, businesses and individuals in our community who help, in so many different ways, to make Kaibosh happen.
